Polish Interpretation of this week's Gospel

Święty Paweł przypomina nam dzisiaj o przykazaniu Pana Jezusa: „Kochaj bliźniego jak siebie samego”.

Ale czy możemy powiedzieć, że kochamy Boga lub bliźniego całym sercem, kiedy jednocześnie nienawidzimy siebie? Czy Bóg nie mieszka w naszym sercu? Czy możemy powiedzieć, że wierzymy w Boga, który jest Miłością, ale nie wierzymy, że On nas kocha?

Wiele pytań, jedna odpowiedź - prawdziwa Miłość. Kochać siebie to tak naprawdę znaczy: uwierzyć i zaakceptować, że jesteśmy godni miłości Boga i naszych bliźnich. Cała reszta to tylko bosko-ludzka historia miłosna naszej odpowiedzi na wieczną miłość Bożą.

Saint Paul reminds us today of the commandment of the Lord Jesus: "Love your neighbour as yourself".

But can we say that we love God or our neighbour with all our heart while we hate ourselves?

Doesn't God live in our heart? Can we say that we believe in God who is Love, but we do not believe that He loves us? Many questions, one answer - true Love. To love yourself is really: to believe and accept that we are worthy of the love of God and our neighbours. Everything else is just a divine-human love story of our response to God's eternal love.
