Sometimes we feel like the little boy in today's Gospel who brought five loaves and two fish with him. He probably felt awkward knowing that he couldn't feed all the people with what he had. Maybe he even regretted that he had brought them, because it would look silly. But without him and his loaves of bread, Jesus would have nothing to multiply. If Saint Mother Teresa had not decided to look after the first poor person she met, God would never have multiplied her good deeds. Every little gesture of love matters. God can multiply it, we only need to take the first step. Just bring the bread and the fish and let the Lord do the rest of the work.
