Polish Reflection on this week's Gospel

Man understands the concept of success and happiness differently from God. For us, it usually equates to wealth, health, a peaceful and stable life for us and our loved ones. From the point of view of God and eternal life, our suffering and everyday difficulties also make sense and cannot stop us from being happy. We need faith that will not only be empty words, but an action that will change the reality that surrounds us. Then our perception of the world will change and we will look at others and at ourselves through the eyes of Jesus. And even seemingly difficult situations in our lives will take on a deeper meaning and it will be easier for us to deal with them.
