



Polish Reflection on this week's Gospel

Often the Word of God challenges us. It could be a matter of language that is sometimes difficult to understand, or just cultural differences. It may also be, because the world we live in usually teaches us to live in a way that is contrary to God's word. Jesus, when asked about Moses who allowed the people to divorce, says that Moses did it because "you were so unteachable." When God's Word becomes a trial for our life, mind or heart, let us ask Jesus for His Spirit to teach us and give us the grace of understanding.

Kiedy słowo Boże staje się próbą dla naszego życia, umysłu czy serca, poprośmy Pana Jezusa o Jego Ducha, aby mógł nas nauczyć i dać nam łaskę zrozumienia.
