Polish Reflection on this week's Gospel

Today's readings remind us that we do not have to carry the heavy backpack of our sins and regrets alone. Jesus came into this world to serve and to pay off our debt on the cross, so that we would live in freedom, without this burden in our hearts. "Anyone who wants to be first among you must be a slave to all." These words may shock many people, but we should not forget that the logic of God's kingdom is different to what we know from earthly experience, and as Christians we should live according to the principles that Jesus taught us.
