Polish Reflection on this week's Gospel

Lord Jesus has personally called each of us to follow Him. It is now our responsibility to find time and build a relationship with Him. But is this the only dimension of Christianity? No. Together, the followers of Christ make up the Body of Christ. Each of us has an important role to play in building God's Kingdom here on earth. St. Paul reminds us that we should take care not only of our faith but also the whole Body of Christ. Take responsibility for each other and understand that our faith and relationship with God are important not only in the context of our own lives, but in a unique way also in relation to an entire community of believers.
