Polish Reflection on this week's Gospel

St. Paul writes that "faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" In today's first reading, God promises Abram that he will have descendants as many as the stars in the sky. Did Abram see this promise fulfilled in his lifetime? No, but he still believed. And do you think that Peter, John, and Jacob could believe their eyes when they saw Jesus with Moses and Elijah? It probably took a while for them to understand in their hearts what really happened on Mount Tabor. Our faith is key to our journey here on earth, and if we can understand Paul's words that "our homeland is in heaven," it will change our perspective and open us to more happiness and love. Lord, increase our faith!
