Within the last year alone, over 5,000 families and individuals contacted CROSSCARE for help, 400 of which were at immediate risk of losing their homes.

It is a profoundly prayerful and symbolic moment during which, with ritual, we recall, acknowledge and celebrate the presence of God in our fragile moments of ill-health.
