Some words of hope from Pope Francis' Hope does not disappoint, Pilgrims of Hope Year of Jubilee 2025



Everyone knows what it is to hope. In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future may bring.

Hope is born of love and based on the love springing from the pierced heart of Jesus upon the cross.

Hope finds its supreme witness in the Mother of God.

In the Blessed Virgin, we see that hope is not naive optimism but a gift of grace amid the realities of life.

We need to recognise the immense goodness present in our world, lest we be tempted to think ourselves overwhelmed by evil and violence. The signs of the times, which include the yearning of human hearts in need of God's saving presence, ought to become signs of hope.

Surely we need to "abound in hope" [cf. Rom 15:13], so that we may bear credible and attractive witness to the faith and love that dwell in our hearts; that our faith may be joyful and our charity enthusiastic; and that each of us may be able to offer a smile, a small gesture of friendship, a kind look, a ready ear, a good deed, in the knowledge that, in the Spirit of Jesus, these can become, for those who received them, rich seeds of hope.

Yet we must not close our eyes to the dramatic situations that we now encounter all around us, not only in certain parts of the world.
